NAME AND TYPE LANTERN, Gasoline, Ouick-Lite Series

MODEL NUMBER -- E20 Poultry House Lantern

FIRST PRODUCTION -- 1924 (Poultry lanterns were made between 1924 and 1929. About 10,000 were produced.)

This lantern, with its outsize fount, was designed in response to letters from poultry growers in which they recounted increased egg production during fall and winter months. These better results were attributed to employing the light from standard Quick-Lite lanterns to lengthen normal laying hours.

The Quick-Lite E20 Poultry lantern was the same as the Model L327 except that it had a 4-quart fount for fuel. One filling was said to give 60 hours of "brilliant service." Early models had a 5-quart fount and air pressure gauge. A steel wool dust screen was used to prevent dust and dirt from clogging burner caps and screens.
